Foster Keiki Health

Foster keiki have disproportionately high and complex healthcare needs. Between 70–92% have a chronic health condition, up to 80% have significant mental health needs, and nearly 40% have serious dental issues.

Keiki Vulnerability

Foster keiki are often the first impacted by policy changes due to limited family advocacy. Complex public insurance requirements and frequent placement changes make it difficult to maintain consistent medical and behavioral care.

Coverage Cliff

When foster keiki age out, the absence of family support, stable housing, and financial security—combined with current federal legislation—puts them at high risk of losing healthcare coverage.
